Kappa Alpha Psi was founded in 1911 on the campus of Indiana University, Bloomington, Indiana and is among the oldest Greek letter fraternity organizations in the world. It is an international organization, comprised of college-educated men of color who are dedicated to achievement, upward mobility and service to communities. Today, the Fraternity has approximately 150,000 members and is comprised of over 750 undergraduate and alumni chapters on college campuses, across the nation in big cites and small towns, and throughout the world. Our members are represented across the spectrum of professions and are significant consumers in the marketplace. Kappa Alpha Psi does not exclude from membership any person because of his race, color, creed, or national origin.

The Miami Alumni Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. is the local graduate chapter of the fraternity. The Miami Alumni Chapter was originated in Miami on November 23, 1946, thus making over 70 years of Achievement, Leadership, and Service to the greater Miami community.

In 2000, the Miami Alumni Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi established the Miami Alumni Kappa Foundation, Inc. as its Internal Revenue Service designated 501 (c) (3) philanthropic arm. Since this time, the Foundation has been committed to sponsoring and the support of other local and national organizations that shares its mission.


